SYMPHONY LAUNCHES d₂w OXO-BIODEGRADABLE PLASTIC AT CROPAK, IN THE BALKANS

The Symphony Group launched its d₂w oxo-biodegradable plastic products in the Balkans at the CROPAK packaging conference in Opatija, Croatia, on Friday 15 May, attended by packaging professionals from all the Balkan countries and representatives from the Environment Ministry. Symphony was represented by Group Deputy Chairman, Michael Stephen.

In a speech at the Conference, and later to national television reporters, Mr Stephen explained that d_2w is aimed at plastic waste which escapes into the environment where it would otherwise lie or float around for decades. d_2w plastic would self-destruct after a short time, leaving no harmful residues.

Considerable interest was shown at the conference in d₂w products, and especially in the world-first announced by Symphony on 13 May of its technology for making oxo-biodegradable metallised film for packaging.

Symphony has distributors in Lubljana and Koper, covering the Balkan countries, and is already the designated supplier of degradable plastic for Delta-Maxi, the region's largest supermarket chain.
