Delta Maxi Group, Serbia's largest retail grocery chain, will be using Symphony Environmental's d₂w oxo-biodegradable additive for all its plastic shopping and grocery bags. These amount to between 15 and 20 million bags a month – around 200 million bags a year.

Delta Maxi's retail outlets include hypermarkets, supermarkets, corner shops and the Tempo 'soft discount' stores. The company will be introducing eco-friendly grocery and shopping bags made with d₂w in all its 300 stores in Serbia over the next three months. They will completely replace the group's existing plastic bags. The next stage will be to provide d2w bags to all Delta retail stores in the emerging markets of Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovenia.

Delta chose d₂w because it is one of the world's most effective oxo-biodegradable products, with extensive worldwide usage. The group liked the fact that with d₂w 'the shopping bags will degrade 100 times faster than normal plastic bags.

The bags made with d₂w will degrade in four years, rather than 400, the time taken by non-degradable plastic.

Plastic made with d₂w will degrade completely on land or in water, without emitting any methane, unlike hydro-biodegradable bags, which take longer to degrade, leave messy fragments and emit copious amounts of methane while degrading. It will also degrade to a pre-set timespan and is fully recyclable.

As a leading retail chain in Serbia, it is our duty to help protect the environment and alleviate the problems of waste caused by heavy usage of plastic bags," says Rajko Mandic, director of Delta Maxi Serbia. "Delta is the first retail chain in the country to switch to eco-friendly bags and we hope others will follow our example.

We also hope our switch to oxo-biodegradable plastic will add to the campaign 'Let's Clean Serbia".

Says Michael Laurier, CEO of Symphony Environmental Technologies, "We are delighted that Serbia's leading supermarket and retail grocery group has switched to oxo-bio plastic made with our d₂w technology. For organisations and communities which are becoming increasingly eco-sensitive, using oxo-biodegradable plastic is the most effective way to cut down on plastic waste, because it degrades completely without leaving any fragments or emitting any methane."
